Professor Shafi Quraishy, Sind Health Secretary and former Principal of DOW Medical College, was shot by unknown driveby snipers on August 4, 1997. The incident happened late in the evening while Professor Quraishy was returning home in his chauffeur-driven official car. Initially, Professor Quraishy was taken to the Civil Hospital where he was operated upon for bilateral hemothoraces requiring blood transfusion, ventilatory support and chest tube insertion. Later, he was transferred to Agaha Kahn Medical Center on August 7 for a spinal decompression and stabilization of cervical dorsal vertebral fracture and cord compression.

By the Grace of God he is making slow but a progressive recovery.



The AMA Establishes an International Medical Graduates Section

The AMA took a big step forward this year in their efforts to better represent the interests of international medical graduates, testament to the commitment of the IMG community within organized medicine. For over eight years, the AMA has had an IMG Advisory Committee that served as a sounding board for the AMA Board of Trustees on IMG issues. The Advisory Committee two years ago was charged with developing a long-term platform that would address the concerns of IMG physicians and enhances AMA membership among this critical segment of American physicians. Last December, at the 1996 Interim Meeting, the IMG delegates to the AMA House of Delegates (HOD) were able to galvanize support for the formation of the AMA's IMG Section. And this past June, at the AMA's Annual Meeting, the HOD adopted the bylaws language providing for the Section's governance structure and mission. The IMG Section will introduce resolutions directly to the HOD and for the first time secures an open mechanism for IMGs (who represent 23% of all US physicians) to influence the policy and initiatives of the AMA.

This access has generated much of the excitement and support for the IMG Section. The Section will embrace the full participation of IMG/ethnic medical associations such as yours. We recognize that you are our constituency and will seek to address the key issued for all IMG physicians: access to residencies, workforce planning, and discrimination within the practice environment (licensure, credentialing, managed care.)


The BOT appointed the IMG Section's first Governing Council last June. I was honored to be among them and we will serve until next June, when we will be succeeded by an elected Council. The election process will begin with the selection of a nominating committee by those attending the 1997 Interim Meeting this December in Dallas. A mail ballot will go out in the spring to all the IMG Section's members, who will each vote for their seven candidates. The seven candidates receiving the most votes will form the Governing Council slate, and from this group the IMG Section assembly will select the various officers for the 1998-1999 Governing Council.

The IMG Section membership process is somewhat unusual. All 40,000 member physicians who are IMGs do not automatically become IMG Section members. The Section is open to any interested AMA member, but they must choose to be part of the Section. Non AMA members may also join the Section provisionally for one year, but must then join the AMA in order to remain IMG Section members.

As with all the other AMA sections, the IMG Section will meet prior to HOD. For the 1997 Interim meeting (I-97) our dates are Friday and Saturday, December 4-5. The tentative schedule includes a reference committee hearing on Friday evening and an Assembly meeting of the IMG Section on Saturday evening, where Section members who are able to attend the meeting will vote on the reports and resolutions before them. We expect that most IMG Section members will not be able to attend our Assembly meetings, therefore all the reports and resolutions, as well as their disposition, will be posted before and after the meeting to the IMG Section webpage on the AMA website, http://www.ama.assn.org, Section members wishing to introduce resolutions for the Assembly to consider at I-97 may fax these to the attention of the AMA Department of IMG Services (DIMGS) at 312/464-5845.

Your interest and participation is critical to our humble endeavor, and I encourage you to join the Section by calling the DIMGS at 312/464-5728 or copying the membership from off our webpage. Please feel free to call me at 313/242-2727 with questions you may have.
