President's Message

Dear Dowites, Assalamu Alaikum

Over the last decade, while APPNA and other alumni have grown, both in numbers and strength, DOGANA has generally been a stagnant alumnus with a lack of clear goals, dynamism and vitality. We have been left on the sidelines and have failed to convince Dow graduates to get involved and be excited about the association. There has been very little follow-up to the decisions made in our 1998 strategic retreat in Los Angeles.

The Executive Council has decided to take on the challenge to change the trend and tide. We have committed to maintain an open communication throughout the year, work hard, and make necessary changes to have a maximum chance of success.

We feel DOGANA has a very rich resource that has been untapped and unappreciated. This resource is the group of established and successful Dow graduates, including past presidents of DOGANA. We plan to reach out to these physicians and ask them to be our guides and patrons in our endeavors. We plan to contact these physicians, during next month, to ask for their help and participation.

In order to achieve our objectives, I have formed three committees. Dr. Iltifat Alavi will head the constitution and bylaws committee. This committee will review the constitution of DOGANA and recommend necessary changes and ammendments to make the constitution more progressive and instep with today's realities. Dr. Ghulam M. Aram will head the membership committee. He is young and energetic, but will need your ongoing assistance and encouragement to increase DOGANA membership. Dr. Shahid Yousuf will chair the publication committee and assume editorship of the Dowlink. This committee will be responsible for publishing Dow Link and will also bring out an annual DOGANA magazine. We hope to publish the first of these magazines before the Atlanta summer meeting of 2000. He has published APPNA Michigan Chapter newsletter regularly. Dr. Abdul Rehman has accepted the editorship of DOGANA journal.

I would like to thank Dr. Mushtaq A. Khan, our executive director for his guidance and patience over the last few months. We are truly fortunate to have a person of his caliber , credibility, and character, a part of our association.

I will end with Iqbal's Saying, which was a part of my predecessor, Dr. Arif Azam's speech in the Los Angeles summer meeting. This so clearly, defines the spirit and mission of DOGANA.

Dr. M. Kaleem Arshad, a life-member of DOGANA and APPNA is a 1981 graduate of Dow Medical College. He came to U.S. in 1981. He has been active in the DOGANA as well in the APPNA activities for last 10 years.

His post-graduate training in U.S. took him through many states. He worked as a house officer in psychiatry at the Provident Hospital in Baltimore, Maryland. He completed his psychiatric residency training at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center and his internship in internal medicine at the Tulane UnversityMedical Center. He was the recipient of the First Annual Jacob Schut Achievement Award for excellence in residency training and professional growth in psychiatry in 1988. He was the Director of Admission Services at East Lousiana State Hospital in 1989 and Medical Director of the Metairie Center for Psychotherapy from 1990 to 1992.

Dr. Kaleem Arshad has been the Medical Director and Chief of Medical Staff at Methodist Behavioral Resources/Methodist Psychiatric Pavillion since 1991. He directs the clinical operations of Methodist Psychiatric Pavillion, a psychiatirc hospital, and five outpatient psychiatric clinics, Employee Assistance Program of Lousiana, Innovative Psych Systems and Return to Duty Management Program.

He is a member of American Psychiatric Association, American Association of Geriatric Psychiatry, American Academy of Addiction Psychiatry, American College of Physician Executives, American College of Forensic Examiners and American Academ of Psychiatry and Law.

Dr Arshad is Assistant Clinical Professor of Psychiatry at LSU School of Medicine. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology and is also certified by the board in subspecialities of Geriatric, Addiction and Forensic Psychiatry. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Forensic Medicine.

He has widely spoken in various issues in psychiatric care including depression, panic disorder and psychiatric care of the elderly. In addition to his administrative rersponsibilities, he has a private practice in New Orleans East and Metairie with spe cial focus on depression, psychopharmacology, anxiety disorders and geriatric psychiatry.

Dr. Sharif in his speech, emphasized the need for Dow graduates to work together for the alma mater.

He also expressed the deep affection and love for Dow Medical college and its graduates He gave a detailed historic account of Dow Medical College and the evolution of Civil Hospital Karachi. He said that Dow graduates should be proud of the institution they received their medical education from. Dr. Arif Azam, outgoing DOGANA President informed members of the current affairs of the association. He said that over his term, there has been a significant increase in the number of life time members of DOGANA He also emphasized the need for better liaison between Dow medical college and DOGANA He emphasized that we should asses the need of the college and make every effort to help our alma mater.

#### AGA KHAN ALUMNI

We welcome Aga Khan Medical College to the APPNA family . We look forward to work with them. Aga Khan Medical College, Karachi becomes the third medical college of Karachi to become a part of APPNA. This was accomplished through the efforts of Dr. Adeel Butt, who had the difficult task of convening such a gathering. At the recent concluded meeting of the Executive Council of APPNA held at the Crown Plaza Hotel, Houston, TX Oct 15th through Oct 17, 1999 APPNA executive committee approved Aga Khan Medical College Alumni Association for seat in the APPNA executivie Karachi hopes to host APPNA winter meeting soon.

#### INCREASING MEMBERSHIP

APPNA membership remains stable and has not shown year to year increase despite a large number of new doctors coming to the US from Pakistan. Various incentives for increasing membership were discussed. Some members felt that APPNA had not done enough to attract. Others felt that enough had been done already and that large numbers of physicians of Pakistani origin waiting to join APPNA is a myth. Physicians in training never had to pay membership dues since the inception of APPNA. AFFILLIATIONOver the years the issue of affilliation of other organizations with APPNA has been discussed. Several years back an application made by some members to encompass .

APPNA under an umbrella organization Pakistani American Congress (PAC) was considered. At that time this notion was rejected. Members cited the independence of American Medical Association which did not become a subject organization of a larger entity.

A new question that has been posed for APPNA is that other organizations may wish to affilliate with APPNA. This quesion was posed to the committee headed by Dr. Khalid Riaz (IL). Various proposals were put forward including that the affilliating organization's board of directors should comprise of 50% of APPNA members. Some members worried that negative developments of the affiliates could taint APPNA simply by a "guilt by association" theory. EC members were cautious in their comments because of past controversies regarding PAK-PAC and APPNA relations. To some the two completely independent entities were totally one unit. Dr. Durdana Gilani former APPNA President once spent half an hour detailing the differences between PAK-PAC and APPNA to former Information Minister, Pakistan Mr. Mushahid Hussain but did not succeed in drawing the distinction. He remained resolute in his belief that they were one and the same thing.

Dr.Adeel Butt asked how would we check the affilliates of the affilliating organization.



## **APPNA SEHAT**

Dr. Naseem Ashraf detailed the progress of APPNA SEHAT from its inception to present. He reported that because of international developments beyond APPNA's control there had now developed an annual shortfall of \$ 250,000 per year.

Many of APPNA SEHAT units had matured and achieved targetted goals and appeared ready for autonomy and phasing out by making them self sustaining. This could free up additional funds to establish newer uints


Widening the scope of the units was also discussed e.g. setting up high blood pressure units or birthing centers.

Over the past 10 years some Rs 14,000,000 had been transferred through APPNA SEHAT from USA to the programs in Pakistan. There are 37 units in operation each serving some 3,200 persons. At present some 127,000 persons in Pakistan are benefitting from these uints. APPNA had provided the seed money in 1989 of \$60,000 for APPNA SEHAT.

Members wrere resolute in their determination to continue it as an APPNA project. Various funding proposals were studied. Pakistani expatriates in the Middle East had pledged an annual sum of \$ 25,000.

Dr. Ikram Ullah Khan Nominated Member of Board of Regents by President Clinton



President Clinton nominated Dr. Ikram Khan as a member of the Board of Regents for the Uniformed Services University of Health Sciences in April 1999.

Dr. Ikram Khan, a Las Vegas (NV) based general surgeon served as the sixth APPNA President, 1984-'85, and PAK-PAC President 1994-1996 . He is a current Director of the Islamic Society of Nevada. Other positions include serving on the Nevada State Board of Medical Examiners from 1985 for four years and was further appointed for another 4 year term to 1993. He has been appointed by the Government of Paksitan to serve on the Advisory Board of Overseas Pakistanis. He received a Presidential Recognition for Health Care Reform Efforts from Clinton on Feb. 7th 1995. He has received Special Congressional Recognition for invaluable community service in 1984. He served on the Health Care Cost Containment Committee of the Nevada State Legislature.

The Mayor of Las Vegas and Governor of Nevada have declared April 30th, 1994 as Ikram U. Khan day. He has also received Distinguished Community Service Award in 1994 from the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith. Dr. Ikram U. Khan has distinguished himself in other positions also.
