

REMARKS NOT EXPUNGED

Chief Court's Orders On Khuhro's Application

Judgment was delivered yesterday in the Chief Court by Bir Godfrey Davis C. J. and Mr. Justice G. B. Constantine in the criminal revision appeal filed by Khan Bahadur Mo hamed Ayub Khuhro for having certain remarks expunged in the judgvillage which suffered no damage ment in the second Atlahbaksh murarthough some of its inhabitants der trial by Mr. B. B. Paymaster, Bessions Judge at Bukkur.

Their lordships observed that the remarks could not be expunged. They said they considered the remarks were not proper and should not have found a place in the judgment.

In the course of the judgment was pointed out that there was noth-Shahbunder sub-division will not ex- ing improper in a judge saying that accused, but that suspicion was not proof. This was quite consistent with an order of an acquittal which necessarily absolved the accused, in the eye of law, of complicity, in the oftence with which he had been churge ed, and of which he had been acquis-

The Chief Judge further observed that while it is proper that a judge should have freedom and indeperdence in expressing his opinion without fear or favour, yet he should not use expressions so as to make the judgment inconsistent, in the sense, that while a person accused of an offence is acquitted, yet by use of certain words, the force of the acquittal is detracted. The chief judge added: "If he exculpates, he must not

Dealing with the remarks which the petitioner had sought to get expunged the Chief Judge pointed out that not only did he think it not no cessary, but also he did not think it was proper for a judge to point out that he had not given an accused person a clean bill. It was not for him to give an accused any bill at all Commenting on other passages, his lordship pointed out that the learned judge was not asked to say whether he had found the accused innocent or not he was asked to say whether he had found the accused guilty of not. 
