

The health and health delivery, though apparently non-productive immediately, is to eradicate the preventable diseases, and improve the quality of living. They need serious rethinking. The present state can be visualised as:

- 2. No career structure.
- 3. Poor working condition.

We feel that unless urgent attention is given at the highest level the situation will soon get out of hand which is not desirable for anyone who is conscious of the crucial stage our country is passing through.


This is the greatest day in the life of a medical student and a very happy occasion for all those who have helped him reach this glorious milestone.




My congratulations to my senior colleagues once again and my thanks to all the workers for their strenuous efforts.



Personally it has been as much satisfying to graduate as it has been frustrating to work as a doctor in Civil Hospital, Karachi. The endless red tapism, bureaucratic lethargy and general apathy have really teamed up to frustrate me.

ON LIFE IN DOW: Life in Dow is a perennial carnival. It is really one of the most colorful and exotic existences possible, for those with a political bent of mind and who wish to add further dimensions to their political career would do well to join Dow. Even the English Parliament would be a poor substitute and the Kremlin would pale by comparison. Academically, however Dow is a barren territory.


ON CHANGES: A lot can be changed and must be changed. Practicals in Basic Sciences in the curricula now are hopelessly outdated

and bear little relevance to current day medicine. The teaching should be, from first year onwards be clinically oriented. Group discussions should be encouraged. The examination system, needless to say, is farcial and should be scrapped. Everybody knows what is to be changed but nobody is willing to rock the boat. The administrators, it so seems, breathe on the status quo.

ON LEARNING: A student wishing to learn has to be a solitary reaper, reaping the bounty of his own labour. Essentially learning in Dow is a personal self service arrangement with frequent discouragements from the teaching staff and only rare encouragements.

ON ATTITUDES: The casual attitude of the faculty as well as the students must go. Medicine is a dead serious profession and lazy jokes which are usually told in final year about becoming a doctor and may God have mercy on the patients, are tantamount to arrogant boasting of their inadequacies and the turtle-like inertia of their thoughts in a science of such lightning momentum as medicine.

Dr. Astad is currently a House Officer in Medical Unit -IV of Civil Hospital, Karachi. He intends to specialize in International Medicine. A star performer, academically and also in the wards, Astad has the potential, initiative and ambition to reach the top, professionally, too.

FOCUS ON ASIF HASAN 2ND POSITION

Perhaps his breadth of vision, perhaps his perceptiveness, perhaps his spryness or perhaps all of these and much much more would make Dr. Asif stand out in any crowd.

Asif is an unassuming, calm and surprisingly witty young man who has inspiration written all over his face and it is not very unoften when he has perspiration all over him, from sheer hard work. Needless to say that inspiration and perspiration together add up to genius. As a friend and colleague and in a scale of zero to ten he is by almost everyone and almost always graded 'Ten'.

ASIF'S VIEWS .-

ON GRADUATION: I am still on my honeymoon having only very recently been formally married to my profession and it has been no bed of roses. It is downright frustrating and outright disgusting to qualify and to start work and be disillusioned so rapidly. The inflated egoes of fresh graduates puncture fairly rapidly because the sweeper doesn't show up, the ward staff takes leave, the laboratory is inadequately supplied, drugs are unavailable, X-ray facilities are inadequate, the laboratory report cannot be relied upon. Under such circumstances the fresh graduate loses enthusiasm and adjusts to the sleepy tedium of life in Civil Hospital, Karachi.

ON UNDERGRADUATE LIFE: Perhaps nowhere in the world can one do a private graduation in medicine - except here. So Dow, is unique in at least one respect. Meaningful teachings are rare and it is the solo effort of the student which helps him graduate. The contribution of Dow is mainly in the form of the four flaky walls and the leaky roofs of the hospital wards. This may seem to be too bad to be true but it is the current state of affairs and the truth. ON MEDICAL STUDENTS: Most of the students do not have an aptitude for medicine. For Pakistani youth the choice of profession is really a simple matter of choosing between Engineering and Medicine. This is unfortunate and under such circumstances there are many who may later regret it. Such students abound and are disinterested to the hilt. Once in the medical college students are not guided properly no counselling is available. Student teacher relationship is virtually nonexistent. Professors are off limits to students. A nonpersonal, over the microphone relationship is wholly inadequate.

Too often, the students make a sheer waste of their time. These students willing to work are too often choosing the wrong books, cramming up and usually making efforts to please the examiners by non conventional means.

ON COMPULSORY SERVICE. Rural or Army service would be fine if a doctor wishes to rest and rust, not otherwise. The reasons are obvious: without an integrated Health Service it is quite foolish to talk of such services and that too under the threat of law, and that too military law.

Currently Dr. Asif is attached to the Medical Unit — II, of C.H.K. He hopes to proceed to England to specialize in Surgery - a field with enormous challenge. Those who know Dr. Asif will repose enormous confidence in him and rightly so. Dr. Asif will be a man to watch in future.

In the Army you will constantly be saluted and will constantly salute with only occassional indulgences in Medicine. Also I cannot see how we can help the rural population on without the basic clinical aids. If we are forced into the villages it would be a waste of talent and time, since most of us are non-conversant with the customs, practices and alnguage of our rural brethren. It is for the students from the rural areas to return to their native villages and work. City folks posted there would speak volumes of the wisdom of the authorities.

ON BEING A STUDENT OF DOW: Academically, life is Dow is like a journey in the time tunnel. You are transported back decades into an era of Simple Muscle Twitch and Gum Acacia.

Socially, life in Dow is not so bad. I regret not having enjoyed much of the much acclaimed social life of Dow because of preoccupations (mainly with books).

Nowadays attached to Medical Unit – II, Dr. Muneer intends to specialize in Surgery. He always wanted to become a Gynaecologist and Obstertician because he believed that ladies make poor Gynaecologist, because their approach is too personal. Now he is not so sure and has opted for Surgery. He l.s not closed the door on medicine and may even plunge into it. After all genius can hardly be compartmentalized.
